Dear Magnolia Families,

We have now completed two weeks of at-home learning and I pray that each of you and your families are well. I am very proud of each of our Monarchs for their great efforts and grateful to all of you parents for your partnership in this endeavor. We have worked hard to build a learning plan that allows flexibility for our families and includes some special opportunities for real time conversations among teachers and students. Seeing one another is an integral part of sharing this experience and we will 'zoom' through this together. We have received very helpful feedback from you, the parents, and continue to welcome your thoughts.

As I am sure you have heard, Governor Abbott has mandated that schools remain closed until May 4. In addition, he has asked each of us to stay home as much as possible to help contain the spread of COVID-19. While we have been asked to live this time of physical distance, we are still very much united with you and your families. A couple of weeks ago, the Pope asked for the flock to pray a Rosary at the same time on a given day. After this experience, one of our teachers asked me if we can do the same with our community. I would like to ask all of our families to join together on Thursday, April 9th at 4:00 p.m. to pray together.
